Using Technology to Support Universal Design for Learning, Assessment and Self-Reflection

Morning Session

Review the Universal Design for Learning (UDL) framework and its guiding principles.

Participants will engage in technology-based activities to gain a greater understanding of how UDL principles can be applied to their teaching practices. Examples of lessons and assessments that follow UDL principles will be examined, and participants will be given time to reflect and discuss their own practices.

Afternoon Session

Explore meaningful self-reflection and assessment strategies aligned with the redesigned curriculum, including a discussion of the Core Competencies. Participants will explore methods of assessment such as rubrics, ePortfolios and web-based tools.
